During the second week of November I finished teaching a subject to students in Ghana by Zoom. I have been doing this on Monday mornings. It has been a blessing and an honour for me to be teaching. My thanks and appreciation to Pr Barry Silverback for asking me to teach in this school.

Our Wednesday night Missions Prayer and Bible Study has been going well and we concluded for the year on Wednesday 30th November for Christmas and New Year. We will recommence our Wednesday night program in January. We have been learning a lot and have also enjoyed some great fellowship along with praying and studying.

Our children's church has been doing well. Mandy Wright is doing a great job with the help of our teenagers. It is so good to see the young ones learning and growing in Jesus.

We had a miracle happen on Sunday 20th November at church. A lady who is the niece of one of our older congregation members walked into church and sat down next to him. She listened to the message preached by our guest speaker. He gave an altar call for people to recommit their lives to Jesus. This lady put up her hand and said the prayer of recommitment. Praise God. She also said she will be coming back and will bring her mother who used to come here many years ago. Glory to God for all He is doing in His time.

We had our Missions Fundraiser Yard Sale on Saturday 19th November. We sold second hand used items that people gave us. Despite the cold we raised USD\$136 for missions. We are all in good health and are doing well. I had a birthday in November. It was great that it fell on our day off. Jethro and Young Warwick continue to do their school online which continues to be a challenge for all of us. Please continue to pray for the boys' schooling.

We had some great fun and family time travelling to Spartanburg and overnighting in a motel. It is much colder now so we are not getting out as much to do some fun things.

The boys and I went and helped a friend with a small project he needed help with for his mother. We lifted up a wooden walkway off the concrete area and put it on some plastic stands to keep it out of the water. We replaced some of the wooden decking.

Our friend reminded us that last time we went there we prayed for the Arthritis in his hands. He then showed me how his hands are now healing up after praying. Glory to God.
